

**MINUTES OF MEETING
HURST CREEK MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT
NOVEMBER 16, 2020**

The Board of Directors of Hurst Creek Municipal Utility District (the “District”) met this date in Regular session, open to the public, remotely and in the District’s offices at 102 Trophy Drive, The Hills, Texas 78738, and the roll was called of the duly constituted officers and members of the Board to wit:

And all of said persons were present thus constituting a quorum.

Also present were Earl Wood and Linda Lunney, Beth Caccamisi, Kurt Pendleton, and Stacey Johnson representing the MUD; Wendy Smith May and Jim Nelson, City Council; Corey Koberg, POA; all attended remotely.

1. Swear in re-elected Directors

Wilson Smith and Jim Wingard were sworn in by the District Clerk.

2. Consider, discuss and take any necessary action regarding the repair of the effluent pond liner

Earl Wood reported that once the water level was brought down below the waterline, a tear in the seam was discovered. During the process of trying to get the patch to stick it was determined that a special cleaner would need to be purchased. If the cleaner works and the MUD can proceed to repair the seam, Mr. Wood would like to purchase a walk-behind unit that is easier to use and makes a better seal. The Board agreed to the possible purchase.

3. Consider, discuss and take any necessary action on drainage

The POA and MUD met about drainage profile types. The POA is putting together a profile of ditch types which will go to the engineers to be studied. Once they receive MUD Board approval, it will be added to the drainage rules. Another issue also discussed was the inspection of drainage work on private property. The MUD has no authority on private property except on right of way and drainage easements. The POA is investigating inspections and engineering drainage on private property in conjunction with the MUD.

Mr. Wood discussed the condition of the FenceCrete fence close to Dewdrop that runs along Lohman's Crossing. The openings along the fence are to facilitate drainage and although it is the responsibility of the homeowner to keep the openings clear of debris some are not kept clear. The drainage easement along the fence is not draining properly. All three entities will need to look at this area for repairs and improvements.

The common area between Camwood and Heatherbloom may need drainage improvement to keep water from running onto a property on Heatherbloom.

4. Consider approving the minutes of the October 19, 2020 Regular Board meeting

Director Maroney moved approval of the October 19, 2020 Regular Board Meeting; Director Wingard seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

5. Consider, discuss and take action approving the October Bookkeepers Report and approval of paid invoices

Beth Caccamisi reviewed the written report showing: \$1,212,037.79 in the General Fund and \$76,036.71 in the Debt Service Fund.

Director Wingard moved approval of the October Bookkeepers Report; Director Paulsen seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

6. Consider and take necessary action to approve the October Manager's Operating Reports

Earl Wood reviewed the written report.

Director Maroney moved approval of the October Manager's Operating Report; Director Wingard seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

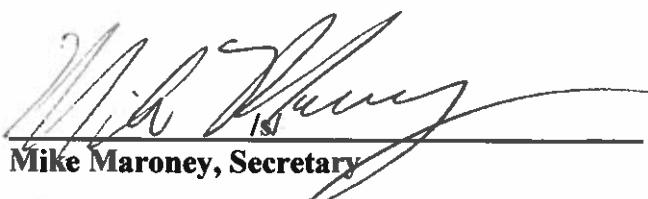
